Applied History Forum 2023, 16 November Weaponized pasts around Europe

History is back. The past has been a tool in the hands of Vladimir Putin; has underpinned voting in the Brexit referendum; has led to sensitive discussions amongst and within EU member states; and has shaped the policies of countless countries in Europe's geopolitical orbit. Even those who once believed that only the future counts, can no longer deny that history again matters deeply to contemporary politics.

This newfound importance of politicized history demands a response from European policymakers and historians. How should we answer the challenges put before us by multiple variants of 'weaponized pasts'? Factcheck and debunk? Study and educate? Or take up arms and create alternative histories of our own?
